

NEW PULPIT AND LECTERN,
CHARLEVILLE CHURCH.

THERE has just been erected in Charleville Church, a new pulpit to the memory of the late Robert Maxwell, Esq., D.L. The pulpit is composed of Caen stone, of octagonal shape, with pillars of Cork red and Connemara marbles polished, with elaborately carved caps. The panels are filled in with statuary marble for the inscriptions. On the opposite side is placed a memorial reading-desk or, lectern, to the memory of Wm. R. Sanders, of Sanders' Park, Charleville. This also is composed of Caen stone with elaborate carvings and marbles of various colours. The book-rest is of one slab of Cork red marble highly polished.

The satisfactory manner in which the above works have been carried out has been testified by the following resolution, unanimously passed by the select vestry of the parish, on the 4th inst. :—

RESOLVED—That the Select Vestry of Charleville wish to express their great satisfaction with the manner in which Mr. C. W. Harrison, 178 Great Brunswick-street, Dublin, has erected the stone pulpit and lectern in Charleville Church, both of which are much admired; and that the secretary be requested to communicate this resolution to Mr. Harrison.
