

MEMORIAL TO
THE LATE BISHOP OF CORK.

A HANDSOME monumental slab has just been erected in Trinity Church, Lower Gardiner-street, to the memory of the late Bishop of Cork, who for so many years ministered in that church, and previously in the Bethesda Church, until the burning of that edifice in the year, 1839. Its size is 7 ft. 6 in. from top to base, and 4 ft. 6 in. across. The material is Galway black marble, and Carrara white marble. Over the inscription slab is a medallion bust of the late Bishop, encircled by a wreath of laurels, and surmounted by a bishop's mitre. Underneath the slab an open bible is represented, with the texts :—"I know that my Redeemer liveth."—Job xix. 15: and, "To me to live is Christ, and to die is gain."—Phil. i. 21.

The inscription is as follows :—

Sacred to the memory of
THE LATE RIGHT REV. JOHN GREGG, D.D.,
Lord Bishop of Cork, Cloyne, and Ross,
To which See he was appointed in 1862, while Minister of
this church,
where, during a period of 23 years,
"He preached the word instant in season, out of season; he
reproved, rebuked, exhorted with all long-suffering
and doctrine, a workman that needed not
to be ashamed, rightly dividing
the word of truth:"
2 Timothy, ii., iv.

He entered into rest 26th May, 1878, in the 80th year of his age.
