

THE CORK EXHIBITION.

SINCE our last issue and notice considerable improvement has been carried out in the arrangement of the exhibits, and the building within now presents a more attractive and complete appearance. The management is most creditable, and exhibitors and visitors have little to complain of. On the whole, the exhibition is fairly patronised by the public; and, as we said on a former occasion, the present industrial outcome cannot but have a good effect in reviving several of the dormant or declining industries of the country.
