The Clerk read a Letter from the Poor Law Commissioners
notifying their appointment of the Rev^d Mr. Low as
Protestant Chaplain to the Workhouse at a Salary of 20^l per Year.
It was moved by Mr Rorke Seconded by Mr Byrne
Resolved that we consider the Salary too high in
proportion to that given to the Roman Catholic Chaplain
there being 106 Roman Catholic ~~paupers~~ ^{paupers} and but 200
Protestant Paupers in the Workhouse. And we respectfully
request the Commissioners to reconsider the matter - and
